Prop Design

- Think about your character.
- Choose a prop: either an object or a drawing that truly represents them
- Draw, design, or plan your prop as necessary!

Rehearsal!

- Choose a partner
- Work in the hallway
- Rehearse your soliloquy and give each other feedback on the following
 - Emotion: Does your partner's emotions match the character's words?
 - Pace: Is your partner speaking too slow? too quickly?
 - Movement: Does your partner move as necessary, or do they just stand there? Does it work for the character?
 - **Clarity**: Can you hear everything clearly?
