Revision vs. Editing

Editing: Looking for mistakes such as spelling errors, errors in punctuation, mistakes, or other mechanical problems.

Revision: Editing the material of your paper, i.e. the logic, clarity, ideas, etc.

Editing Common Mistakes

- Run-on sentences
- Comma Splices
- Problems in Citation

Editing Common Mistakes

- Comma Splices 2 independent clauses cannot be joined by just a comma
 - Incorrect sentence: Hamlet becomes so obsessed with revenge, he ignores the needs of everyone else around him.
 - Correct sentence: Hamlet becomes so obsessed with revenge, <u>and</u> he ignores the needs of everyone else around him.

Editing: Common Mistakes

- Golden rule: Join two independent clauses with a comma and then a conjunction
- Remember your conjunctions: FANBOYS
 - For
 - And
 - Nor
 - But
 - Or
 - Yet
 - **So**

Editing: Common Mistakes

- Introduce quotes with one of the following
 - A comma with a verb of saying (Hamlet says, ...)
 - A colon (Hamlet immediately vows to take revenge:
 ")
 - A period (Hamlet's behavior towards Ophelia is erratic and disturbing. "Quote" (citation).
- Citations (Act #, Scene #, Line #s)
- Punctuation goes <u>after</u> the quote not inside the quote. Put the mark of punctuation <u>after</u> the parentheses.
