As a group, you will create a podcast with 4-5 segments. You will create one segment as a whole group, and you will create one segment as an individual. For each segment, you will write a script which will be handed in. This script will be in the form of a thorough Graphic Organizer. You will use these scripts to record your podcasts on Garageband.

**Group Segment:** As a group you will create a segment that covers the following information to give your listeners background information on your topic.

- What is the Great Migration and/or Harlem Renaissance?
- What you're going to be talking about in your podcast generally.
  - Poetry
  - Music
  - Art
- The major poets, artists, and musicians you will be focusing on.
- The major similarities that connect these different poets/artists/musicians and their work.
  - What themes/central ideas do they share?
  - What stylistic elements do they share?

**Individual Segment:** As an individual you will create a segment that explores one artist more fully. Your segment will include the following.

- An analysis of 2 pieces from pre-selected poets/artists/musicians
  - If you're in a poetry group, you will analyze and compare 2 poems
  - If you're in a music group, you will analyze and compare two songs
  - If you're in a visual art group, you will analyze and compare two images

To do this, your segment will follow this format...

- Introduction: Background Information on your poet/artist/musician
  - Who, what, where, when, why, how
- **Body Paragraphs:** Analysis of the two texts. 1 paragraph for each text individually. 1 Paragraph for how they are similar to and/or different from one another.
  - What are they trying to say?
  - What are their themes/central ideas?
  - What is your evidence?
- **Conclusion**: Takeaways
  - How do these pieces connect to the Harlem Renaissance and/or Great Migration?
  - Why are these pieces worth discussing and studying?
